We want change now; Students meet with mayor to present their action plan to save their local wetland.

Grade 11 students from Super Made-Up High School are meeting with Springfield Mayor Joe Quimby this Friday at 1:00 PM to detail their plan to save a local wetland.

Students will have an opportunity to sit down with Mayor Quimby at Springfield Town Hall and detail their plan with the hopes of securing funding from the municipality.

The school has partnered with Ducks Unlimited Canada and local Pristine Wetland Centre to create a two-year plan to restore Pristine Wetlands, which includes building a complete 360-degree boardwalk around the wetland, duck-banding inventory, and constructing a fence to keep cattle out of the water.

"This is our chance to take action that matters and do our part in creating a better future" said student Susie Somebody. "We can be the difference. We just need mayor Quimby's support."

Super Made-Up High School and Pristine Wetlands partnered with Ducks Unlimited Canada in 2018 to become a Wetland Centre of Excellence. Through conservation initiatives and action projects, students have coupled outdoor fieldwork with their school curriculum in the hopes of creating a sustainable future.
